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University Overview

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1.1 The Sponsoring Body

Established in 1985, the Bhopal-headquartered organization has been tirelessly working to reach the remotest corners of the country to empower people through education, generate employment for the youth and nurture to realize entrepreneurial dreams.

AISECT is recognised as India's leading skill development, training, and education services provider, with an unrivalled and robust network of over 37,500 centres across 28 states and five Union Territories. A recipient of several national and international awards, AISECT has transformed the lives of over 2 million students, through a host of skill development programs. It has imparted skills-based training to over 26 lakh people, created employment opportunities with in the network for more than 1,00,000 people and empowered the lives of over 50 lakh people through various innovative products and services. AISECT has also expanded its reach in international markets and has set up offices and training centers in Ghana and UAE.

AISECT has partnered with the NSDC to offer skills-based training to 16 lakh youth by 2029. Under this partnership, 25 vocational training academies have been set up that offer over 150 low-cost, high-quality University certified certificate and diploma courses. 
Course wise Admission 2023-24




UG Gender wise Admission 2023-24




Category wise Admission 2023-24





The gender audit identified several gender-sensitive features within AISECT University:

- **Ladies Common Room:** Provided on the 1st Floor of the main building, offering a dedicated space for female students and faculty.
- **CCTV Monitoring:** Installation at various campus locations, particularly in high-traffic areas like the library and major gates, enhancing safety and security.

Empowerment Initiatives: Organizing lectures by eminent personalities and workshops on topics such as prevention of sexual abuse, health and hygiene, and legal aspects of sexual harassment. These initiatives aim to empower female students and foster a safe and supportive environment.

6.3 Gender Representation Audit at AISECT University

Undergraduate Level

- **Overall Gender Ratio:** Over the past five years, approximately 40% of the total undergraduate students admitted are girls. This indicates a balanced representation at the undergraduate level.

Postgraduate Level

- **Increasing Female Ratio:** In contrast to undergraduate programs, there is a notable increase in the representation of female students at the postgraduate level. Girls outnumber boys significantly, with instances where they constitute up to 60% more than their male counterparts across all categories of PG courses.

Representation by Discipline

- **Humanities and Social Sciences:** There is a stronger representation of female students in disciplines within humanities and social sciences. This trend reflects a higher preference among female students for these fields.

Admission Policy and Safe Environment

- **Admission Policy:** The university strictly adheres to prevailing rules without separate reservation for women students. Despite this, the substantial voluntary admission of girls indicates a positive reputation for providing a safe and inclusive environment.

Infrastructural Facilities

- **1. Classrooms, Toilets, and Library:** Adequate facilities are available for both male and female students, ensuring equal access and convenience.
- **2. Girls' Common Room:** Described as clean, well-ventilated, spacious, and more than adequate, the Girls' Common Room serves as a welcoming and supportive space for female students on campus.
- **3. Environment of Support:** There is a demonstrated environment of attentiveness to the needs of women students and staff, fostering a supportive atmosphere within the university.


Conclusion

Skill Development Cell Introduction:


